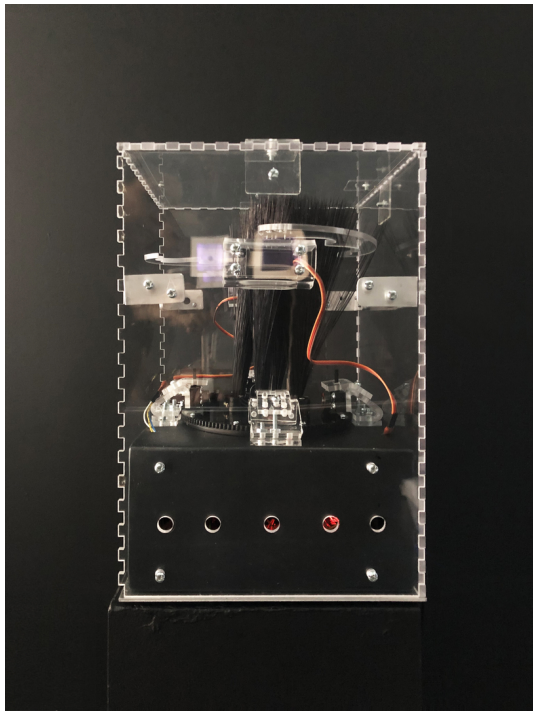

A WONDER TO BEHOLD

By the 19th century, the mighty Processional Way and Ishtar Gate leading to King Nebuchadnezzar II's grand 5th century city of Babylon had collapsed. Literally sorting through boxes and boxes of pieces and fragments, German archaeologists reimagined and recovered portions of the wall, recreating the dragons, lions, and bulls which decorated its walls. An account of the recovery process and a section of the wall are on display at the Institute for the Study of the Ancient World.
